SB 1070 TERRORIZES HISPANICS, MAKES COMMUNITIES LESS SAFE

Washington—With just days before Arizona’s SB 1070 immigration law is to go into effect, Immigrants’ List—a bipartisan political action committee dedicated to meaningful immigration reform—expresses its deep objection to the measure. Immigrants’ List also asserts its hope that the US District Court in Phoenix will block SB 1070 from being enacted.

SB 1070 misleads the people of Arizona into believing that terrorizing the Hispanic community is the solution to a complex problem. There can't be a system where individual state and local governments decide who is here lawfully and who is going to be punished for immigration violations. Only Congress can fix the immigration hole the country has dug itself into.

“This law is unconstitutional and will be an unnecessary burden on both the state and county budgets. This law will also deter immigrants from cooperating with law enforcement and will ultimately make our communities less safe,” says Maurice Goldman, an Immigrants’ List board member and an Arizona immigration attorney.

“SB1070 is a warning to our Congress to pass comprehensive immigration reform that will fix our broken immigration system once and for all,” Goldman added.
